

# Y.T. 2016 - FUSE - ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

## Arrival & Departure

The weekend will begin with registration in the Pavilion on the **Shoreline site** at JPC (36 Salvation Army Rd – Jacksons Point) at **7:00 pm** on Friday evening. The first session will begin at 8:00 pm. It is recommended that you have dinner prior to your arrival. The weekend will conclude after lunch on Sunday afternoon, approximately 1:30 pm.

## What You Need to Bring

It is very important that you bring the following items:

- Bedding & Towels
- Toiletries
- Appropriate clothing for the weather and the various activities (i.e. Bubble Soccer, sports, archery tag)
- Closed toed shoes are needed if you choose to participate in rock wall climbing.
- A Bible

It is also recommended that you **bring spending money and some extra cash** to use to support FUSE our FUNDS, the FUSE Olympics, and the mission offering on Sunday morning.

## Archery Tag

If you are planning to play archery tag on Saturday please bring with you the waiver form (available at [www.fuse.army](http://www.fuse.army)) signed by a parent guardian (if under 18 years of age). If you do not have a signed waiver you cannot participate in archery tag.

## Uniform

On Sunday, **Officers** are expected to wear **summer uniform**. If there are delegates who would like to wear their uniform on Sunday they are encouraged to do so but it is not required.

# FUSE OUR FUNDS



This year at YT we will once again be fundraising for justice / mission initiatives. We will be joining with the other FUSE events across the territory to support **The Mombasa Children's Home**, and the **Likoni School for the Blind & Visually Impaired** in the Kenya East Territory. Our fundraising this year will take the form of an athletic competition and an effort to embarrass some of our chaperones.

As in previous years, these events will not require that you have large amounts of money. \$5-\$20 per person at the most, or less, or none at all. Nobody will have to miss out on the fun if they cannot bring along extra funds but you are encouraged to bring along as much as you can to support our fundraising efforts. We are very blessed here in Canada and it is an act of worship to give sacrificially to help the Kingdom of God to grow in other parts of the world.

In addition to these fundraising activities the event shirts will be on sale for \$10 each to support our fundraising efforts and we will be taking up a justice offering as a part of our worship on Sunday morning.

## FUSE Olympics

The FUSE Olympics will take place on Saturday afternoon. Corps are encouraged to put together a team to participate in a wide range of 'sporting' activities. The lineup of events includes:

## HOW IT WORKS

1. Each team will compete in as many events as they can during the afternoon and points will be awarded for participating in an event and more points for winning the event.
2. In order to participate in an event or game the team must pay an entrance fee.
  - a. So a team can continue to play an event they are good at and rack up a lot of team points as long as they pay the fee to play each time.
  - b. The entrance fees will be minimal and will be correlated to number of points available for participating. So higher the entrance fee, higher the payout.
3. The top three teams will win great prizes from the Youth Department (see below).

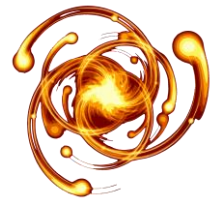
## PRIZES

The three teams with the most points accumulated win great prizes from the Youth Department for their Corps:  
**1<sup>st</sup> Place – \$500** (minimum) worth of resources and prizes, including a free week at camp for one young person this summer.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Place - \$250** (minimum) worth of resources and prizes.

**3<sup>rd</sup> Place - \$100** (minimum) worth of resources and prizes.

## Late Night FUSE

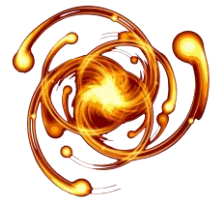
We are excited about a new twist for YT 2016, were calling Late Night Fuse. A part of Late Night FUSE will be an opportunity to have some fun with the guests and your chaperones and raise funds at the same time.

### HOW IT WORKS

1. All chaperones names go into a 'hat' at the beginning of the weekend.
2. During Late Night FUSE we choose names from that hat to participate in some 'games' that will be entertaining for everyone!
3. For each game we will choose more names then are needed and the young people get to choose which chaperones have to participate in the game by voting for them with money (this part is like our ATS talent show / fundraisers we have done in previous years.)
4. The contestants receiving the most money will get to play the game. The more money you give the more likely your chaperone or leader will have to embarrass themselves, I mean play the game, in front of everyone.

## **SOUL FUSE: STAYED** — Phil Laeger
